The second message of President Ugo Valbusa (cont.)

I would like to address your attention to the series of IUVSTA Conferences held in this period; the first was the 9th European Vacuum Congress EVC 9 held in Paris in April, a traditional meeting for the scientist and engineers working in the area of vacuum science and technology. The meeting was held in conjunction with the Vacuum Exhibition Vide 2005 organised by the Manufacturer Committee of the French Vacuum Society (SFV), and with the celebration of the 60th anniversary of the SFV, one of the oldest vacuum society and a founder member of the Union.

In June, the 13th International Congress on Thin Films (ICTF 13) was held in Stockholm together with the 8th Atomically Controlled Surfaces Interfaces and Nanostructures ACSIN. The conference was in the Congress Centrum of the city of Stockholm, the same location where it will hold in 2007 IVC-ICSS. In July VASSCAA 3rd was organized in Singapore and in September in Berlin there was the annual symposium of the surface scientists ECOSS which is now at its 23rd edition. All these events, prepared and successfully organized by IUVSTA Divisions and by its member Societies show that IUVSTA plays a key role at the international level by bringing all different types of scientists, engineers and technologists together to discuss issues of common interest and promote the use and development of vacuum in science and technology.

In ECM 98 there will be a continuation of the discussion on the planning of IUVSTA workshops. I am expecting a large number of proposals from the Divisions and a planning for the Highlights seminar session which will be held at the ECM-100.

The educational activities are continuously monitored by the Educational Committee. In ECM 98 the committee will discuss educational programmes, how to build new contacts in non – member Countries and how support activities in member societies.

I am please to announce that the IUVSTA has received a new donation from the Funai Electric Advanced Applied Technology Research Institute Inc., (FEAT). I am very grateful to the President of FEAT Dr. Tadashi Sasaki that contributed to increase the donation fund.

The Iran Vacuum Society has requested to become part of IUVSTA. I have contacted the President, Prof. A.Z. Moshfegh, and I have invited him to attend ECM98 as observer.

The October 2005 issue of Physics World, the international magazine for members of the Institute of Physics, will include articles and case-studies covering the breadth of vacuum technology that physicists and engineers use for their work in both industry and academia. I contributed writing the article "Vacuum around the world". The paper describes the role of the International Union for Vacuum Science, Technique and Applications at the international level and illustrates its activities.

I am sure that there will be a large attendance at the ECM 98. The contribution and the collaboration of all councillors are extremely important to warranty the success of the actions that IUVSTA is preparing.

ECM-98 Vienna



The next Executive Council Meeting ECM-98 will be hosted by Austrian Vacuum Society. It will be held near Vienna, 30 September - 02 October 2005 directly after ECASIA. The venue is the village of GUMPOLDSKIRCHEN, located approx. 20 km from Vienna. This can easily be reached from Vienna by local train or car (approx. 30 min travel time). The meeting location will be a Seminar center at the "Deutschordensstift Gumpoldskirchen", an old abbey transformed to serve as a Seminar-Center. The ECASIA-05 will take place from 25 - 30 September 2005 at the Vienna University of Technology.

The **ECM 99** will be hosted by American Vacuum Society. It will be held at SanDiego, California, on 28th – 30th April, 2006 in association with the 2006 ICTMF meeting.

The ECM-100 is still open for invitation by national vacuum societies.
