



Location - Place and Venue

- Sydney CBD (Central Business District)
- Sydney Masonic Conference and Function Centre (SMC)
 - Easy access from the international airport by train, shuttle bus and taxi.
 - A selection of many hotels associated with the SMC are within a few minutes to 10 minutes walking distance. We have arrangements with five SMC affiliated hotels close by and offer these hotels in our registration package outlined below. Hotels ranging from 3.8-4.1 stars are:
 - Vibe, Travelodge, Adina Apartments Sydney and Central, Ibis World Square
 - Possibility to book other hotels in the area at own cost (and hence reduced registration cost) - wide selection from budget to five star.
 - Venue for VASSCAA-9.

Costs

460 Euro (\$690 AUD) participant, 600 Euro (\$900 AUD) participant+accompanying person.

- Saturday sightseeing cruise of Sydney Harbour, cocktail/dinner. Informal after-dinner speech to be given by the President of IUVSTA.

Travelling to the location

- Easy access from the international airport by train, shuttle bus and taxi. Train direct from the international airport into Museum station and 5 minute walk to hotels and SMC.
- Cost is between \$18-50 AUD.
- A selection of many hotels associated with the SMC, and the ones that we are proposing to use, are within a few minutes to 10 minutes walking distance to the SMC.

ACCESSIBILITY



- Participants from the United States, Europe, the Middle East, Africa and Asia can fly to Sydney on a direct or one-stop flight at least once per day from major cities worldwide.
- On average, there are approximately 37 direct flights per day from Asia, 11 from the USA, 5 from United Arab Emirates and 1 from South Africa.
- Major international airlines offer direct or one-stop services from key hub cities including Los Angeles, London, Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Johannesburg, Bangkok, Hong Kong, Singapore and Santiago.
- Sydney is <11 hours from East and Southeast Asia, and <14 hours from Vancouver, San Francisco, LA, the Gulf States, South America and South Africa.
- Over 25 European cities have 1-stop access.

STREAMLINED VISA APPLICATION PROCESS



The IECN sets the world standard for visa delivery services for delegates attending events in Australia and has attracted interest from foreign governments as an example of best practice.

- Australia offers the significant benefit to conference and meeting participants of the free International Event Coordinator Network (IECN) service provided by the Australian Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP).
- The IECN service is the only one of its kind in the world, making participation in a global event easy by providing specific advice on the what, why and how aspects of the application process.

Sydney Science Festival and National Science Week, 11–19 August 2018

Sydney Science Festival encourages people of all ages and knowledge levels to discover, discuss and debate science through a program of talks by world-leading researchers, hands-on workshops, exhibitions and events for family exploring all areas of STEAM. The Festival brings together a diverse group of research institutions, museums, universities, industry, and community across Sydney and Western Sydney.

National Science Week is Australia's annual celebration of science and technology. It is an initiative from the Inspiring Australia strategy, which was developed by the Australian Government to increase engagement and interest in the sciences. Running each year in August since 1997, it features more than 1700 events around Australia.

The VSA in collaboration with the Museum of Applied Arts and Sciences (MAAS) are developing an ongoing exhibition entitled "Vacuum Now and Then" (or some such title) to be first shown during VASSCAA-9 and the Sydney Science festival and National Science week which will be all running during the same week.

• Sydney experiences year round temperate climate. Sydney's subtropical climate gives average temperatures ranging from 16°C in the winter months to 27°C in summer.


Safety
